First, I would like to thank the village board for helping to establish this project. 10 years ago the village developed a state-required comprehensive plan for our future growth. In the development of the plan, many meetings were held with village and surrounding community residents. One of the many items proposed by the residents was the need for a Community/Senior Center.

We are happy to announce this project is in the development phase with a 501C3 non-profit organization. This group is comprised of 9 members from various backgrounds. **Wisconsin Election Laws: Photo ID &
Other Recent Changes (Effective 2012)**

Photo Identification:

Beginning in 2012, you cannot receive a ballot until you have met ID requirements. (See the "Photo ID Exemptions and Exception" section.) Wisconsin does not issue a separate "Voter ID" card. Instead you must use one of the photo IDs listed below. Your photo ID does not need to show a current address:

Acceptable forms of Photo ID:

- ◆ Wisconsin driver license*
- ◆ Wisconsin DOT-issued photo ID card*
- ◆ U.S. passport*
- ◆ Military ID card*
 - *The above documents may not have expired earlier than the date of the last November election.*
- ◆ Certificate of naturalization issued within last two years.
- ◆ Unexpired Wisconsin driver license or state ID receipt.
- ◆ ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin.
- ◆ Unexpired ID issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college that contains an issuance date, student signature, and expiration date within two years of issuance, along with a separate document showing proof of current enrollment.

If you are eligible to vote but do not have an acceptable ID, you may obtain a free ID for purposes of voting. Please visit <http://gab.wi.gov> and click "Voter Photo ID" for more information.

Photo ID Exemptions/Exceptions

Photo ID is always required when voting at the polling place and at the clerk's office unless you are a confidential elector.

Photo ID is not required for these absentee voters: Military electors, Voters who are permanently abroad, Confidential electors.

Wisconsin Election Laws: Photo ID & Other Recent Changes (Effective 2012), Continued:

Photo ID is not required, but is replaced with alternative requirements for these absentee voters:

Indefinitely confined voters, Nursing home and other care facility residents who have ballots delivered by a Special Voting Deputy, Residents of care facilities who are not visited by a Special Voting Deputy.

For further information, contact your municipal clerk.

Provisional Ballots: Voters who do not provide Photo ID

Voters, including absentees, who are required but unable to provide photo ID may vote by provisional ballot.

Provisional ballots are not counted unless the voter provides an acceptable photo ID to the municipal clerk by 4 p.m. the Friday after the election.

Changes to Absentee Voting

Absentee in the Clerk’s Office: Absentee voting in the clerk’s office is now restricted to the two weeks before an election. Absentee voting now ends at the close of business the Friday before the election.

The new law prohibits absentee voting and voter registration the Saturday, Sunday or Monday before an election.

Beginning in 2012, absentee voters in the clerk’s office must present the same type of photo ID required at the polls (see previous listing).

Absentee Requests by Mail

Beginning in 2012, absentee requests for ballots sent by mail must be accompanied by a photo copy of an acceptable form of voter ID (see previous listing).

Once you have sent the clerk’s office a photo copy of your ID, you will not need to send photocopies with future absentee ballot requests by mail, fax or email unless you change your name or address.

Absentee Requests by Email/Fax

If submitting an absentee request via fax or email, you must either include a photocopy of acceptable ID with your request or in your absentee ballot envelope.

Signing the Poll Book

Voters must sign the poll book to obtain a ballot. The poll book now contains a signature block for each voter. Only one poll book needs to be signed.

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Notice of Rate Increase Water Customers of the Elk Mound Municipal Water & Sewer Utility

This is to give you notice that the Elk Mound Municipal Water & Sewer Utility will file an application on December 1, 2011, with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC), for authority to increase water rates. Rates for general service will increase 3 percent. The increase is necessary to reduce the existing deficiency in present rates. The request is being made under Wis. Stat. 196.193. Rate increases granted under this statute do not require a public hearing. The effect of the increase for some selected customers is shown below. Public Fire Protection and Wholesale rates (if applicable) will also increase 3 percent.

This rate increase will go into effect on January 20, 2012.

Wisconsin Election Laws: Photo ID & Other Recent Changes (Effective 2012), Continued:

Voters unable to sign the poll book because of a physical disability are exempt from this requirement. If this applies to you, tell the election officials that you are unable to sign because of a disability. Election officials will write "exempt" in your signature block.

Hospitalized Voters

Hospitalized voters may appoint an agent to pick up their ballot from the clerk's office. The agent must present the hospitalized voter's photo ID to the clerk's office.

Voter Registration Changes

You can register to vote up until the Friday before the election or on Election Day. You must reside at your address for 28 consecutive days to be eligible to vote, and you may no longer use a corroborating witness as proof of residence.

Proof of residence is required when registering less than 20 days before an election, on Election Day and for first time Wisconsin voters registering by mail. For more information on acceptable proof of residence documents contact your local municipal clerk.

Cross Connection Control Program



Overview

The Village of Elk Mound Public Water Utility system delivers safe, high-quality drinking water every day. To continue to protect the public health and keep the water system safe from contaminants and pollutants we are required by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Wisconsin Department of Commerce, and the Village of Elk Mound Municipal Code to maintain a cross connection control program.

In order to reduce overall costs for compliance with DNR Regulation NR810.15, the Village of Elk Mound Water Utility has contracted with Hydro Designs, Inc. (HDI), of New Berlin, Wisconsin to assist in managing our program. HDI is an environmental services firm that specializes in backflow prevention education and cross connection control programs and inspections. Hydro Designs Inc does not sell plumbing devices, installations or perform backflow preventer testing. Each HDI Inspector carries an easy to see Photo Identification Tag Issued by Wisconsin Rural Water Association. Furthermore, each inspector has been employed full time at HDI for a minimum of 1 – 4 years. A third party background check record is available upon request. HDI will perform the initial inspections of commercial, industrial and potentially residential buildings throughout the community to detect actual & potential cross connections and make recommendations for the installation of backflow prevention devices or assemblies where necessary. This will help ensure that contaminated or polluted water cannot backflow into clean drinking water.

What Is a Cross Connection Control Program?

WI DNR 810.15 Defines a CROSS-CONNECTION CONTROL PROGRAM as; The supplier of water for every municipal water system shall develop and implement a comprehensive control program for the elimination of all existing cross-connections and prevention of all future cross-connections. A record of the cross-connection control program shall be kept current and available for annual review by the department

- ◆ **Public Education Program**—We will inform our water customers with newsletters, brochures, public awareness meetings, cable access channel programming, and access to informational videos. - ◆ **Notices to Owners** - Notify the building owner of a scheduled inspection date and any required corrective action
- ◆ **Cross Connection Survey**—All Residential and Non-Residential facility plumbing systems which are connected to the public water supply will be inspected to determine if cross connections exist as required by the WI DNR Regulation NR810.15.
- ◆ **Installation of Protective Devices**—Backflow prevention devices or assemblies will need to be installed at the owners expense where known unprotected cross connections exist as required by Dept. of Commerce Chapter Comm 82.41.
- ◆ **Annual testing**—All backflow prevention assemblies will be tested once a year by a State of Wisconsin certified tester of the owners choice.

Cross Connection Control Program (Continued)

What Is a Cross Connection?

A cross connection is a direct or potential connection between any part of the public water supply system and a source of contamination or pollution. The most common form of cross connection is a garden hose, which is easily connected to the public water supply system and can be used to apply a variety of potentially dangerous substances, including chemicals and fertilizer. Other common cross connections include dishwashers, toilets, pressure washers, boilers, pools, and lawn sprinkler systems.

How Does Contamination Occur?

Water normally flows in one direction, from the public water system through the customer's cold or hot water plumbing system to a faucet or other plumbing fixture. Under certain conditions, water can flow in the reverse direction. This is known as **backflow**, and it occurs when backsiphonage or backpressure is created in a waterline.

Backsiphonage may occur when there is a drop in the supply pressure of the water distribution system. This can be caused by a water line break, water main repair, or during a rapid withdrawal of water from a fire hydrant. This creates a vacuum, which may pull or siphon contaminants or pollutants into the drinking water supply.

Backpressure may be created when a source of pressure, such as a pump, boiler, or other building creates a pressure greater than that supplied from the water distribution system; this may force water to reverse direction.

What is a Cross Connection Survey?

The cross connection survey is the first step in our program. Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Regulations (NR 810.15) recommends that all industrial, commercial, and institutional facilities be surveyed for cross connections regularly (every two to six years depending on the degree of hazard within the facility). A survey is a walk-through of the water-system piping in a building or property, starting at the water meter and ending at the last free-flowing tap. At the end of the survey HDI will produce a report describing any violations or discrepancies found, as well as a time frame for compliance. The first round of inspections will include city-owned buildings, public school facilities, hospitals/medical facilities, car washes, industrial/manufacturing facilities, and mortuaries. Inspection notices will be mailed to water customers approximately two weeks before the scheduled inspection date. A representative should be available during the inspection to answer questions and provide access.
